

## AVERY HILL TEXT INFO

### THE LOCATION

Avery Hill Campus is part of the University of Greenwich, and based in the south-east London borough of Eltham. The campus is made up of two sites – the Mansion and Southwood sites – which are set in 86 acres of scenic parkland. These are home to English Heritage listed nineteenth- and twentieth-century buildings, including the Winter Gardens, a Victorian tropical hothouse which contains wonderful plant specimens.

Nearby is Eltham Palace, a combination of Art Deco chic and the remnants of Henry VIII's boyhood home. You might also like to visit Avery Hill Park, or Severndroog Castle. Greenwich, with The Old Royal Naval College, The Royal Observatory, the Cutty Sark and a host of other destinations, is nearby.

The campus is in zone 4, and well served by train links to the capital. Trains to Charing Cross or Cannon Street take 25 minutes, and bring students to the major sites of London.

### THE CENTRE

This new ISIS centre is based on the recently extended Southwood site. As part of the University of Greenwich, the campus has excellent academic facilities, and state of the art sports facilities and tennis courts. Standard and en-suite accommodation is available.

The activity programme includes five half-day trips into London, which will be supported by link lessons on the history and culture of the UK. Students will also enjoy full day excursions to Brighton, Cambridge, Salisbury, and a river boat disco on the Thames.
