

THE LOCATION

Bognor Regis is an historic sea-side town, given the title 'Regis' after King George V stayed there briefly there in 1929. Most of the town centre is now pedestrianized, and still has a fishing industry working from the town's beaches. The main attraction of this popular seaside resort is its long stretch of coastline, with a mixture of sandy and pebble beaches, and the beautiful old pier. The famous Butlins Bognor Regis resort lies at the eastern end of the promenade and is the largest holiday centre in the South of England.

Bognor is less than 40 km west of Brighton and 10 km southeast of Chichester. It is easily accessible from London airports.

THE CENTRE

ISIS Bognor Regis is based in the University of Chichester's Bognor Regis campus, which has some beautiful Georgian architecture, including three grand mansion houses, St Michael's, The Dome and Mordington House. The campus is set in a leafy environment, and has excellent modern teaching facilities. All accommodation offered is on site, and both en-suite and standard rooms are available.

The activity programme at Bognor includes three shuttles to the local towns of Arundel, Felpham and Chichester. There are also full-day excursions to Eastbourne, London and Portsmouth. The academic programme will draw on the local area's culture and history so that students make the most of their time with ISIS.
