

THE LOCATION

Christ's Hospital School was founded by Edward VI and has existed at different locations for over 450 years with the same goal of offering boarding school education to children from all backgrounds. The school retains the Tudor uniform with long blue coat, breeches and yellow socks, and maintains the tradition of pupils walking into lunch accompanied by a band (weather permitting).

The school is based 2 km from the traditional market town of Horsham in Sussex, which has an abundance of medieval and Tudor buildings integrated with modern piazzas. Trains from Horsham station travel to London Victoria and London Bridge, both in about an hour.

THE CENTRE

ISIS Horsham enjoys the beautiful setting of the turn of the century buildings, some of which incorporate features from the school's previous locations. There is a large historical dining room, as well as new refurbished boarding houses, offering 1-4 bedded standard rooms. Other excellent on-site facilities include a purpose-built dance studio, a leisure centre, and a swimming pool. This is a particularly beautiful ISIS centre.

The activity programme includes two shuttles into nearby Horsham; two full day trips to London by train; and full day excursions to Brighton and Oxford.
